Author Focus Mini Grey


Mini Grey has long been celebrated for her playful picture books that sparkle with humour and creativity. Whether it's the superhero antics of Traction Man, the clever detective tale of Hermelin the Detective Mouse, or the environmental twist of The Last Wolf, her stories brim with wit and warmth. She has the ability to take familiar themes and turn them on their head, making her books not only entertaining but layered with meaning, encouraging readers to look closer and think deeper.

Her latest work feels like a true publishing landmark: an illustrated abridged edition of Ted Hughes's classic The Iron Man. For decades this story has captivated children, but Mini Grey now makes it accessible for a younger audience without losing its magic or power. Her vibrant illustrations bring Hughes's vision to life with boldness, humour, and an irresistible sense of character.

The Iron Man isn't frightening — he's simply very, very hungry. His appetite for tractors, fence posts and farm machinery alarms the local community, who trap him in a deep pit. But with the help of Hogarth, a boy with kindness and imagination, the Iron Man finds a new home in the scrapyard, surrounded by all the broken cookers, bedsteads and cars he could ever want. A perfect introduction to a classic, destined to become a family favourite for years to come.




Donut Squad


Rune: The Tale of the Obsidian Maze
